**A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING CONCERN
FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE COASTAL
DUNE SYSTEM AND ITS IMPACT ON THE
DEVELOPMENT OF THE INTERIOR.**

WHEREAS, the City of Daytona Beach Shores, Florida, is located along the Atlantic Ocean and has 5.5 miles of coastline; and

WHEREAS, many citizens reside in condominiums and single family homes located adjacent to the Atlantic Ocean; and

WHEREAS, our City is a key coastal resort and tourist area; and

WHEREAS, coastal dunes and seawalls are important components of any community-based effort to enhance the habitat of the shoreline; and

WHEREAS, dunes offer a measure for protection against storm and erosion affects; and

WHEREAS, that protection may be increased through the “man-made” enhancement of the dune system; and

WHEREAS, some residents and condominiums have experienced problems with beach erosion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, CITY OF DAYTONA BEACH SHORES, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE: The State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection, The U.S. Department of Environmental Protection and the City of

Daytona Beach Shores, should be encouraged to work together to find both natural and man-made solutions to beach erosion/dune restoration issues.

SECTION TWO: This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
